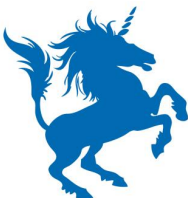


Uniform





- Following consultation with staff, students, parents and carers in February 2026, our uniform will be changing from September 2026.
- There will be a two-year transition period from September 2026 to September 2028 with all current students allowed to choose which version of the uniform to wear until all are required to wear the same style.
- All new students starting with us in September 2026 will wear the new uniform.





The school uniform consists of:

- Navy jumper with the school logo or a navy blazer with the school logo
 - Plain dark grey or black trousers
 - Pleated dark grey skirt (worn below the knee)
 - Navy or white polo/shirt
 - Grey, navy or black socks/tights
 - Plain black footwear
 - Lanyard (to be worn with card showing correctly)
 - School tie with House cog - KS4 only (optional)
- Outdoor clothing such as coats, hoodies, hats, gloves, scarves etc. to be removed once inside the school building.

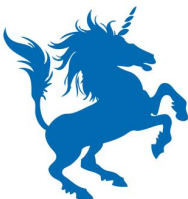

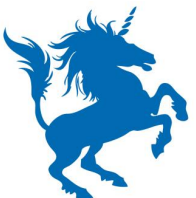
Footwear

Must be **all** black.

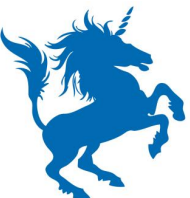
This is always the case and includes when young people may have an injury.

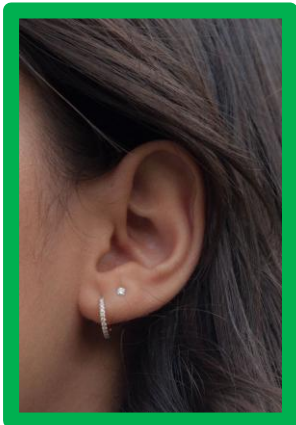
Standards

- All year 7 students will receive a free re-usable water bottle.



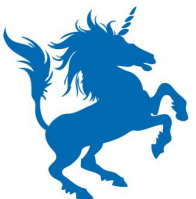

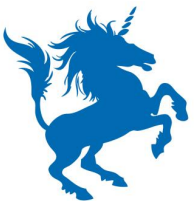
Attendance and Attainment

- There is a strong link between attendance and attainment.
- It is clear and backed by research that those students with high levels of attendance are far more likely to reach their potential.
- The message regarding attendance is simple:
17 school days missed leads to $\frac{1}{2}$ a GCSE level dropped on average.



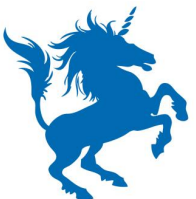
Attendance and Wellbeing

- We must prepare our young people for successful transition to adulthood



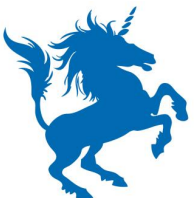
Attendance

- Any student marked absent for registration will trigger an automatic phone call home unless you have contacted the school on each day of your child's absence
- The school needs a minimum of two emergency contacts, preferably three. (Family members must be over 18)



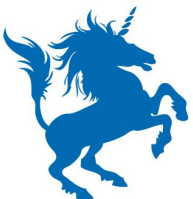
Attendance

 - ✓ the expected date of their return to school



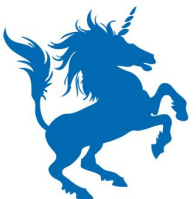
Attendance – Medical Appointments

- Students will need to be collected for the medical appointment and must sign out/in at student services.

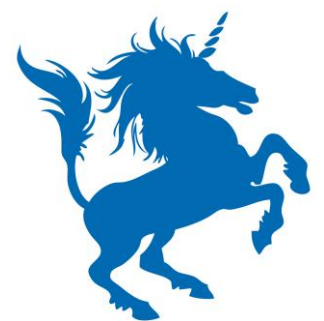
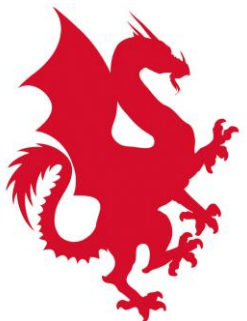


Attendance – Holidays

- Term time holidays are not permitted.
- Leave of absence forms are available on the school website and from student services.
- Leave of absence forms must be completed four weeks ahead of planned leave so that any exceptional circumstances can be taken into consideration and processed.
- Unauthorised leave of absences, could result in parents/carers receiving a penalty notice from the Local Authority.

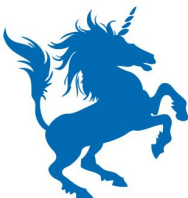


Personal electronic devices



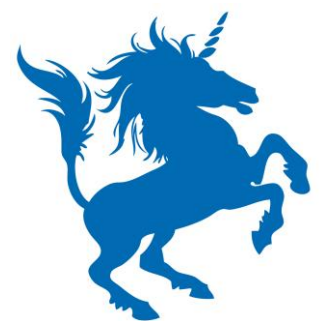
Personal electronic devices include, but are not limited to the following items:

- Mobile phones
- Smart devices such as watches *
- Handheld entertainment systems, e.g. games consoles, mp3 players
- Portable internet devices, e.g. tablets, iPads
- Students are not permitted to use any of these devices during the school day.



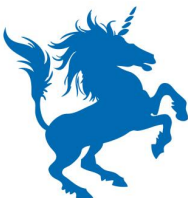


Yondr Pouches



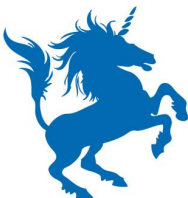
Yondr pouches

- Educational research identifies a clear correlation between a young person's development and their use of electronic devices. Excessive screen time and unregulated use of such devices by children and adolescents can lead to potential negative impacts on physical and mental health, like sedentary behaviour, disrupted sleep, cyberbullying, and increased stress and anxiety. In addition, there is strong evidence that uncontrolled use during school hours could lead to distractions, hampering the learning process and academic performance.
- Since April 2025, all Passmores students have been required to place their mobile phone and other devices (e.g. smart watches and headphones) into a Yondr pouch.



Yondr pouches

- Every student is assigned a personal Yondr Pouch. It is each student's responsibility to bring their Pouch with them to school every day and keep it in good working condition. Damaged or broken Yondr Pouches will need to be replaced at a cost of £15 to the parent/carer.
- Between the hours of 08:00 and 15:15, personal electronic devices (Mobile phone, Smart watches etc) will always be switched off and stored in their personal Yondr pouch. Pouches must be kept either in students' lockers or in their bags until 15:15 or until the student has left the premises.



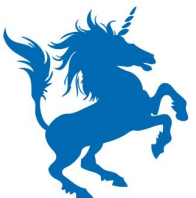
Yondr pouches

- At the start of the day

- 1) Students will open their pouch at a centrally located unlocking station

When entering the building:

- 2) Turn their phone off
- 3) Place their phone (and if applicable other devices) inside the Pouch and secure it in front of a member of staff
- 4) Store it in their bag for the day

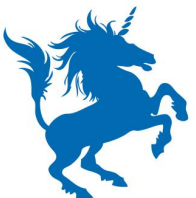


Yondr pouches

- At the end of the day

Students will:

- 1) Open their Pouch
- 2) Remove their phone
- 3) Close their Pouch (important to stop the pin bending in the bag)
- 4) Keep in their school bag overnight.

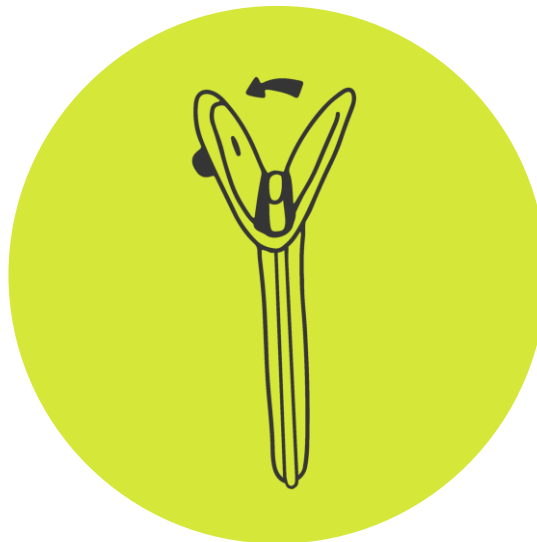

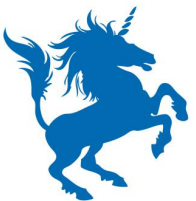

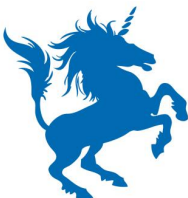

Phone seen during school

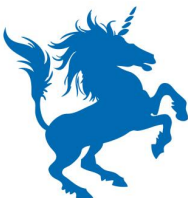
- If a student is found in possession of a phone outside a Yondr pouch, the phone will be confiscated, and a same day 60 Minute after school detention will be issued in the first instance.
- A second instance will result in a phone call from a senior leader and a same day 90 Minute after school detention will be issued.
- A third instance will result in a parental meeting and the student being required to hand their device in a length of time to be agreed upon by the Principal or Vice Principals.

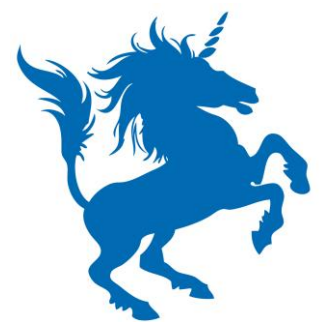
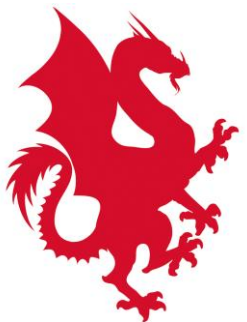
Forgotten Pouch

- If a student forgets their Pouch, their phone will be collected, and the office will notify home.
- The phone will be returned to the student at dismissal.
- Students will receive a -1 behaviour point for not having their pouch, 3 of these will trigger a 30 minute after school detention.
- If a student consistently forgets their Pouch, it is considered Lost.

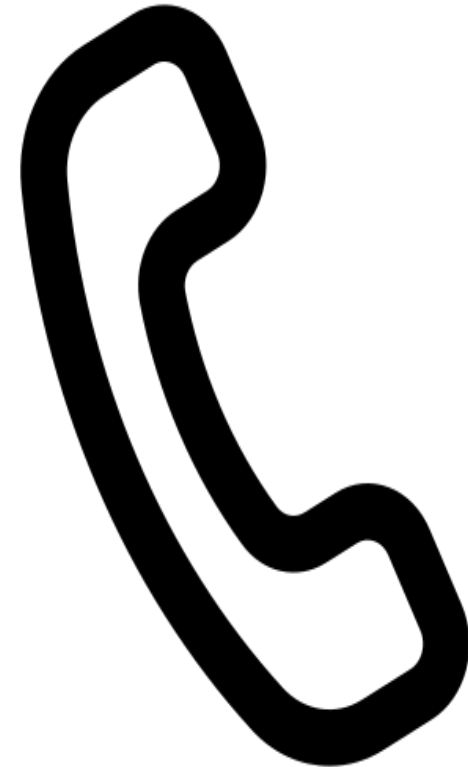
How do I contact my young person?

Parent/carer calls the school reception, and a message will be delivered to the student.

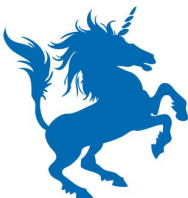
If your young person needs to use the phone, there is one available at student services. This is for emergencies only.



First Point of Contact

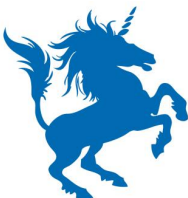
As form tutor, I am your first point of contact for anything related to your young person.

Please do not **just** contact for any issues, we love to celebrate our young people and their achievements outside of the school so help us celebrate the good as well as offer support.



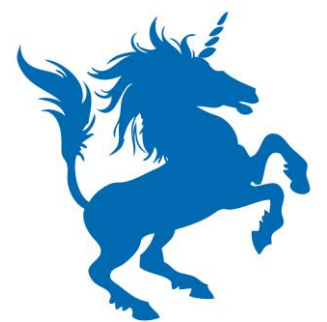
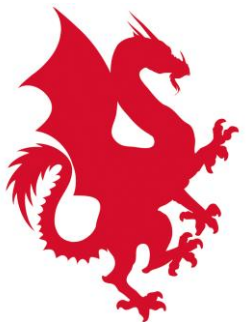

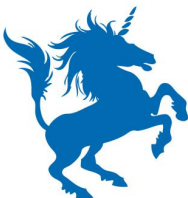


Summer School



Summer School 2026 (20th-24th July)

- Doors will open at 8:30am
- Registration 8:45am
- End of the day 3:15pm
- Students need to wear comfortable sportswear with trainers – this is important as they will be taking part in sporting activities most days.
